TRAFFIC INCIDENTS IN AUSTRALIA

There are about 3,500 people killed in road accidents each year in Australia, another 30,000 to 32,000 are seriously injured.

Information published by the Commonwealth Bureau of Statistics and various State/Territory authorities show that road accidents have certain trends and patterns.

Here are some examples:

- Young drivers are involved in serious accidents to a much greater extent than would be expected from their numbers in driving population. A disproportionate number of accidents involve people in the 17 to 25 year age range
- Mobile phone use is a serious contributor to road deaths and serious injury
- Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays are the worst days of the week for accidents. Between them, these days account for more than half of all road casualties in Australia
- Of the drink drivers killed in Victoria, 50 percent are between the ages of 18 to 24 years
- Factors that impact on road accidents are:
 - Driver stress and fatigue
 - Adverse weather and road conditions
 - Impairment to vision such as, sun, glare, rain, night driving and blind spots
 - Use of mobile phones while driving
